<b>YOUTH &amp; ADULT SERVICES</b>	<b>CARING HANDS FOOD PANTRY</b>	Provides food, personal care items, and basic nutrition resources to eligible South Community clients experiencing food insecurity. Access is available through an in-house referral from a South Community provider.
	<b>CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) CO-RESPONDERS</b>	South Community clinicians partner with local police departments to respond to behavioral health crises in the community, providing immediate mental health support, de-escalation, and follow-up care coordination.
	<b>COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES / CASE MANAGEMENT</b>	Comprehensive support for youth (age 6+) and adults experiencing significant emotional or behavioral challenges. Services help individuals stabilize and succeed at home, school, work, and in the community.
	<b>EQUINE ASSISTED THERAPY</b>	Experiential therapy sessions involving guided interaction with horses, led by a licensed mental health professional and trained equine specialist to support emotional growth, confidence, and coping skills.
	<b>MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING</b>	Outpatient therapy for children, adolescents, and adults using evidence-based approaches to address mental health concerns and support personal growth. Services are available in person, in-home, and through telehealth.
	<b>PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES</b>	Medication evaluation and ongoing medication management provided by psychiatric professionals as part of a comprehensive behavioral health treatment plan.
	<b>SUBSTANCE USE &amp; RECOVERY SERVICES</b>	Outpatient treatment for individuals struggling with alcohol or drug use. Individual and group services use evidence-based practices and a harm-reduction approach while also addressing co-occurring mental health needs.
	<b>LEARNING INDEPENDENCE &amp; FAMILY EMPOWERMENT (LIFE Program)</b>	The L.I.F.E Program provides Intensive Home-Based Treatment (IHBT) and utilizes Functional Family Therapy (FFT) to support youth ages 11-17 and families navigating complex emotional and behavioral challenges. In-home therapy includes frequent sessions, crisis management, and family support, helping youth stay in their home environment.
	<b>SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAM</b>	School-based mental health services within our contracted districts for qualified youth and adolescents. With a team of therapists, 10+ case managers and behavioral health specialists providing mental health interventions, our programs ensure students receive dedicated support during school hours. Our services also remain involved with the student and their family over the summer months to preserve achieved gains into the following year.
	<b>SCHOOL-BASED PREVENTION PROGRAM</b>	In partnership with Montgomery County ADAMHS, prevention programs help students build resilience, strengthen decision-making skills, and reduce risk factors related to mental health and substance use.
<b>SOUTH CONNECTION</b>	An enrichment-focused latchkey program serving K-6 students in Oakwood City Schools, offering structured activities and supervised care before and after school and during the summer.	
<b>YOUTH POSITIVE HEALTH DAY TREATMENT PROGRAM (YPH)</b>	Trauma-informed staff support youth, families, and schools by bridging the gap between outpatient care and inpatient psychiatric hospitalization. Ages 6-17	

<b>ADULT ONLY PROGRAMS</b>	<b>ASSERTIVE COMMUNITY TREATMENT (ACT)</b>	A multidisciplinary team providing intensive, community-based services for adults with severe and persistent mental illness. Services include therapy, medication support, case management, housing assistance, and vocational support.
	<b>INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT PROGRAM (IOP)</b>	Structured outpatient treatment for adults with substance use disorders or co-occurring mental health conditions. This 12-week program includes group therapy, individual counseling, and medication support to help individuals build recovery skills.
	<b>COMPREHENSIVE DUAL RECOVERY (CDR)</b>	Integrated outpatient treatment for adults experiencing both mental health challenges and substance use disorders, helping individuals work toward recovery and long-term stability.
	<b>SHAPING UP PROGRAM</b>	A wellness program combining fitness, nutrition education, and support from a health mentor to promote healthier lifestyles and improve overall well-being. Eligibility requirements apply.
	<b>SPECIALTY COURTS SERVICES</b>	Comprehensive behavioral health services for adults on specialty court dockets, including mental health and substance use disorder treatment and recovery supports to promote prosocial engagement, accountability and sustained recovery.
	<b>SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT</b>	Employment and benefits counseling services that help individuals prepare for, obtain, and maintain meaningful employment while managing their behavioral health needs.
